



Andrew Snyder, CSW is the Viticulture and Enology Program Director/Professor for Grayson College. Snyder has taught for the online consortium with the National Science Foundation's Viticulture and Enology Science and Technology Alliance, offering courses in Winery Marketing, Tasting Room Management as well as viticulture courses. He instituted the Redlands Community College program and taught there for seven years. He has taught in higher education for the past 18 years. Professor Snyder earned three master's degrees from the University of Oklahoma in Human Relations, Adult Education and Communications. He earned his undergraduate degree in Business from Schiller International University in Heidelberg, Germany where he lived for 14 years. Snyder has twice won teaching innovation awards from the Oklahoma Association of Community Colleges. His viticulture and enology training include coursework from UC Davis and SIU in Strasbourg, France as well as the Grayson program.

Snyder owns two wineries: Sand Hill Vineyards a boutique winery in Calumet, OK and Chapel Creek Winery in El Reno, OK.

Snyder serves as president of the Oklahoma Grape Growers and Winemakers Association, a member of the Texas Wine and Grape Growers Association, American Society of Enology and Viticulture and the Society of Wine Educators, where he has earned the (CSW) Certified Specialist of Wine accreditation. He recently completed the U.C. Davis Wine Executive Program.
