



Dr. Justin Scheiner is an Assistant Professor and Extension Viticulture Specialist in the Department of Horticultural Sciences at Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas.

In his Extension role, Justin provides educational programming and technical support for grape growers in the Gulf Coast Region and North Texas. His research program focuses on best management practices for vineyards in areas affected by Pierce's Disease.

Justin also teaches undergraduate courses in the Department of Horticultural Sciences at Texas A&M and is a member of the graduate faculty. Previously, he served as the Director of the Viticulture and Enology Program at Grayson College in Denison, Texas where he taught a variety of viticulture and enology courses.

Justin received his B.S. in Horticulture and Crop Science from Sam Houston State University and his M.S. in Molecular and Environmental Plant Sciences from Texas A&M University. He holds a Ph.D. in Horticulture from Cornell University where his dissertation research focused on viticultural factors that affect methoxypyrazines.
