Grape Berry Ripening and Sampling Techniques

When are the grapes going to be ready to harvest? Well, it depends...

Harvest determination is often a tricky subject here in Texas. Ripening grapes encompasses many different variables that change year to year depending on the weather and location. Our hot, unpredictable climate can lead to rapid changes in berry development and expedited

harvest. Unpredictable weather can bring hail damage to the High Plains and flooding to the lower Rio Grande Valley all in the same growing season. Texas is so large and diverse that the difference in harvest date can vary as much as four months between specific regions. These unique challenges require close monitoring by producers on a year to year basis.

This article will review the changes that occur during grape berry ripening and cover specific berry sampling procedures that can help growers closely monitor the ripening process right up to harvest.

The 2019 growing season bestowed blessing and curse for Texas vineyards, with a challenging growing year culminating in lower yields but the promise of exceptional wines from Texas wine grapes. Early harvest varieties in Northeast Texas are bearing out the forecast of high-quality 2019 fruit.

"This season has been the tale of two extremes for most producers," said Michael Cook, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension viticulture program special in Denton. "We had an exceptionally wet spring from the Gulf Coast to Hill Country and High Plains over to North Texas. Ample rains started in the fall and didn't stop. All that rain was a blessing and a curse."
